- Tour through downtown, learn about the Great Fire of 1889 and see what was built from the rubble. Listen to stories of Spokane's colorful past.
- See Riverfront Park, the former Expo 74' site. Hear stories of the Native Americans that came to live and fish there.
- Take a Bird's Eye View of Spokane, learning about the our geology and industry.
- Tour inside the majestic Saint John's Cathedral.
- Visit Manito Park and walk through the formal Duncan Gardens, Japanese Gardens, flower-filled Conservatory and Rose Gardens.
- See the historic mansions in Browne's Addition. Your guide will tell you some intriguing stories about the people who prospered here in the late 1800's and built their lavish homes.
- Drive by the castle-like Spokane County Courthouse, the Historic Flour Mill and Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena.

Spokane Winery Tour

- ♦ Arbor Crest Wine Cellars, named one of "50 Great Producers Every Wine Lover Should Know," by Wine Spectator Magazine. Taste their wines and tour the unique grounds of the Cliff House, once owned by an inventor.
- ♦ Mountain Dome Winery, Washington's premier sparkling winery, made in the traditional French method of Champagne.
- ♦ Latah Creek Winery and Gift Shop, with award winning wines and great shopping with gifts for wine lovers and products made in the Northwest.

Every Friday: 1:00pm–5:00pm. Cost: \$48.00 Adults / \$46.00 Seniors 65+. You must be 21 years old to go to Arbor Crest.

Walking Tour of Historic Browne's Addition

Meet at the Northwest Museum of Arts and Culture at 2361 N. First Ave. in Browne's Addition, just West of downtown Spokane.

- ♦ After millionaire J.J. Browne platted 160 acres in the late 1880's, it soon became one of the most socially correct addresses in the city. As you stroll past the ornate mansions, your guide will tell you stories of the people who had them built, how they made their fortunes and the architects who designed them.

Every Monday: 1:00–3:30pm, departing from The Northwest Museum of Arts and Culture in Browne's Addition at 2361 N First Ave. Cost: \$20.00 Adults / \$12.00 ages 6–12. Under 6 free. Minimum 6 guests The MAC is closed on Mondays.

Every first Friday of the month, downtown art galleries, wineries and boutiques stay open late with live music and special offerings. No worries about driving and finding a place to park! 5:00pm–8:30pm.

Historic Walking Tour of Downtown Spokane

- ♦ As we wander through Downtown, see what rose from the rubble after the Great Fire of 1889 and learn about its' colorful past.
